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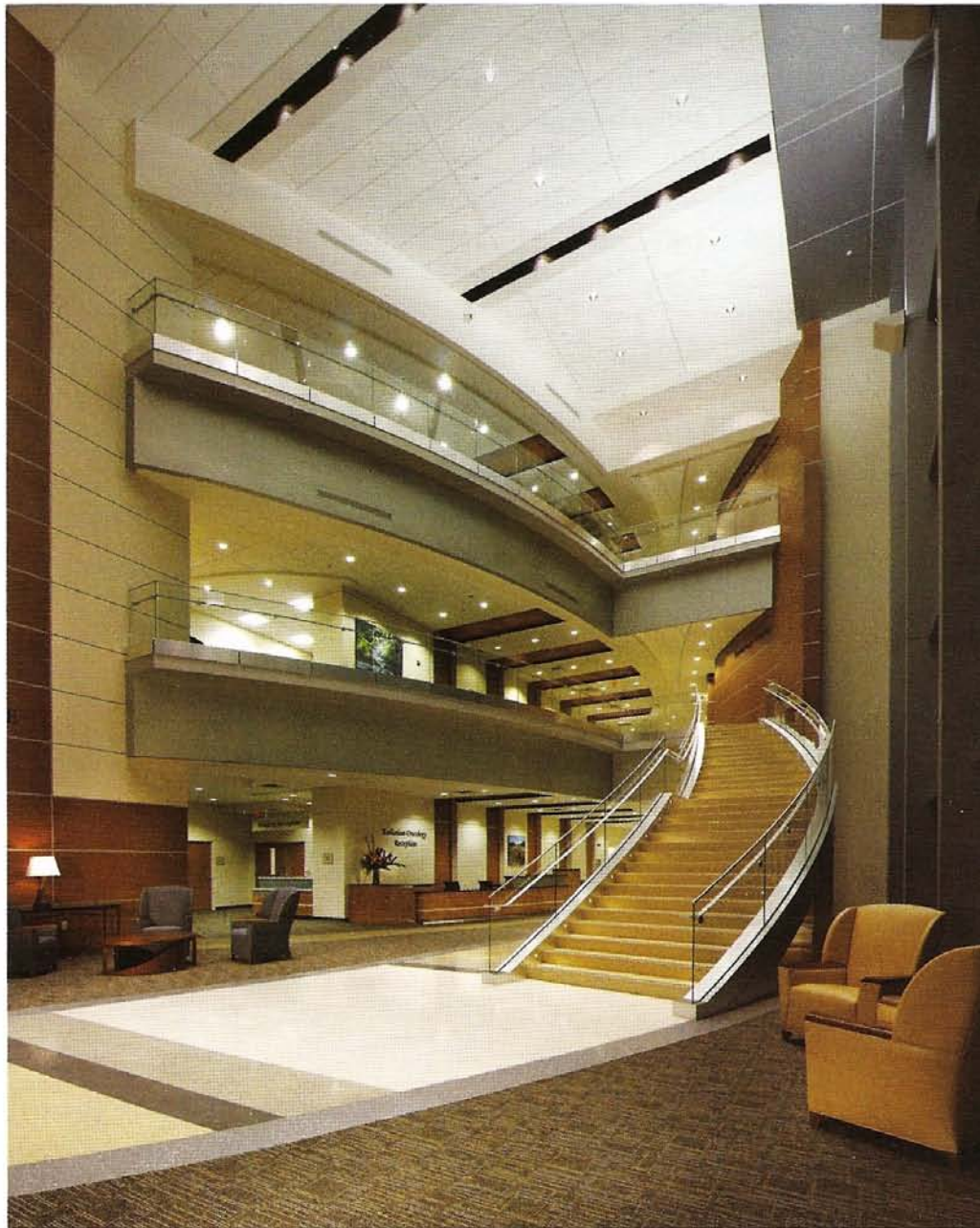


HKS, Inc., Orlando, is designer of the Harvey & Phyllis Sandler Pavilion at Boca Raton Community Hospital. The pavilion houses the Eugene M. & Christine E. Lynn Cancer Institute and BRCH Outpatient Imaging. The Lynn Cancer Institute treats more than 3,000 patients each year and offers treatment technology that is among the most sophisticated in the country.

“Creating a calming environment for patients battling cancer to rebalance the spirit, mind and body” is the philosophy that earned HKS the opportunity to design the pavilion. Reflective of the nearby coastal beaches, the pavilion was designed with bright, clean accent colors and a warm neutral background palette.

The first floor of the building features BRCH Outpatient Imaging and Radiation Oncology. The second floor houses the Center for Hematology-Oncology as well as the Chemotherapy and Infusion Center. The third floor includes the multi-modality clinics, administrative offices and a high-tech conference center. Public access to the building is via a three-story, naturally lit atrium. The atrium unifies the building and provides access to patient and family amenities such as a café, gift shop, pharmacy, family resource center and palliative care areas. It also serves as a guide, reorienting patients as they progress throughout the building.

In addition to aesthetics and functionality, the Pavilion is designed to support the patient safety initiative set forth by the hospital. Through overall standardization of the patient treatment areas and carefully selected building materials and systems, the facility will create a positive impact patient care delivery.
